



# **Disasters and the Dispatcher**

This course provides telecommunicators with communication and planning techniques that have a direct impact on the successful outcome of a disaster-caused emergency. It describes the fundamentals of emergency management and identifies other agencies that may become involved when a disaster occurs. It also discusses the steps used to maintain PSAP operations, and the response, including pre-arrival instructions, used in different types of emergencies.

## Goals

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to demonstrate the following skills.

- 1. Plan for continued operation of the PSAP during and shortly after a disaster.
- 2. List and explain the fundamentals of emergency management and how local, state, and federal government may become involved when a disaster occurs.
- 3. Describe the Incident Command System and how it relates to the PSAP and the telecommunicator, including the requirements by the federal government for Level 100 ICS training.
- 4. Demonstrate and illustrate the steps needed to assure continuity of operations (COOP) of the PSAP during and immediately following a disaster.
- 5. Describe the impact of natural disasters such as floods, hurricanes, winter storms, and earthquakes and discuss pre-arrival instructions appropriate for these emergencies.
- 6. Describe how to respond, and list pre-arrival instructions, for man-made disasters including terrorism, riots and arson.
- 7. Demonstrate and employ unified call taking principles that reinforce the importance of emergency management in the telecommunication center, using techniques such as the Journalistic Investigative Approach.
