

Foundations of Call Handling

Welcome to the Foundations of Call Handling. This course describes the role of the telecommunicator in an emergency response. It explains PowerPhone's structured call handling approach and how it helps to effectively communicate with callers. It explores the liability risks to Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP) and individual telecommunicators and discusses strategies to limit exposure to liability. It also discusses the types of stress telecommunicators can experience and provides techniques that can help manage work-related stress.

1. Describe the responsibilities of a telecommunicator.
2. Define and discuss the Total Response System as a logical process of structured information gathering and framework for obtaining and relaying consistent, accurate and actionable information on every call for service.
3. Apply PowerPhone's Journalist Investigative Approach to call handling.
4. Recognize and demonstrate effective communication in call handling using PowerPhone principles.
5. Take an active role to minimize liability at the individual and agency level.
6. Recognize the signs of situational stress and take action to manage it.
